...from the Pastor...

...Please welcome Fr. Rich Tillman from UNBOUND this weekend... This weekend, July 29-30, we will be visited again by Fr. Rich Tillman on behalf of *Unbound* – formerly the *Christian Foundation for Children and Aging*. He is a priest of the Archdiocese of St. Louis, once pastor at St. Charles Borromeo Parish, who for the past ten years has been on special assignment as a preacher for this ministry and working on immigration reform. He last visited us in 2011 and was very well-received. Here is some information he sent about *Unbound* and its work.

Unbound was founded by Catholic laity and is an organization that has served more than 600,000 children, youth and elderly in nineteen developing countries since 1981 – empowering them to make more choices in their lives, live with dignity and reach their potential.

Unbound's unique sponsorship program is highly personalized. It matches a child, youth, or aging person at a project overseas with a sponsor in the US who cares about and encourages that person. With a monthly contribution, a sponsor helps to provide much-needed nourishing food, medical and dental care, the chance for a child to go to school, livelihood programs for families and much more.

When you sponsor through *Unbound*, you offer a hand up to a family working to lift themselves out of poverty through hard work, initiative and hope. A monthly contribution of \$36 directly benefits the specific individual you sponsor to help meet their basic needs. But sponsorship also does so much more. *Unbound* programs empower sponsored individuals and their families with tools to achieve self-sufficiency. Local staff members work with sponsored families on how to best use their benefits to achieve personal and family goals. This may include resources for nutrition, health care, education and skills training, improved living conditions, seed capital for a small business or farm. Families are able to invest in their children's education, develop livelihoods and become active community participants. Over time, they rely less on sponsorship and more on their own income-generation activities. *Unbound* sponsorship is about individuals and families helping each other. It is a connection between someone who wants to give help and someone who needs it. *Unbound* sponsorship lifts people up — both the sponsor and the sponsored — in ways that are large and small.

Unbound believes they are on the leading edge of fighting world poverty. Poverty isn't just about lack of money – it's about lack of choices. *Unbound* has found that families make good choices when they have support and encouragement. They invest in the education of their children. They develop livelihoods and become active community participants in the spirit of true sustainability. *Unbound* works with families at the grassroots level with local staff. Their social workers visit the homes of the families and listen to their needs. They work with children to set education goals. They visit the elderly. They bring families together in small groups to support one another and improve their community. You partner with them in this effort. Your sponsorship provides direct, personal support for your friend and family. It encourages them. It gives them choices. It allows them to develop their talent and fulfill their potential.



At the heart of the *Unbound* program are two concepts:
 ● Families make the best decisions about how to overcome the challenges they face. ● Small groups of people working together build lasting support structures for a community.

Unbound employs a three-tier approach to measuring program effectiveness and outcomes for sponsored persons and their families. This framework reflects *Unbound's* commitment to personal relationships and outreach, while recognizing the value of evaluation for program development and the power of experience in a global organization. **The Plane** (Global) captures multiple programs and countries, but a lesser degree of detail. **The Plaza** (Local) provides a picture of a community, but only in its own context. **The Porch** (Individual) offers broad detail, but narrow understanding.

Unbound's individualized program and one-to-one sponsorship model allow them to understand and communicate outcomes not just at a global or community level, but on a very personal level. Regular letters written by children, youth and elders to their sponsors provide a unique and personal update on the specific impact of the program in their lives. Letters provide direct feedback about how the relationships and support make a difference. We encourage sponsors to look for and ask about the experiences and accomplishments presented in their sponsored friends' letters. Does she discuss how she is progressing in school? Does he mention his mother's participation in a mothers' group or how the benefits of the program are impacting his family?

They also understand, however, that some sponsored friends are not great at communicating outcomes. Some lean toward only communicating the good and some fill their letters with other important personal details and gratitude. For these reasons, they are growing in their ability to gather and communicate data on individual changes and impact, through individual participant records, educational benchmarks and exit surveys.



- 51% of sponsored children stay in school more than a year longer than their peers.
- 77% of sponsored children participate in the program through organized small groups
- 90% of mothers helped by the program come to believe they have the power to change their family's lives.

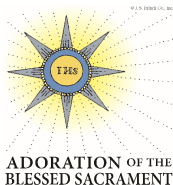

Parish School of Religion Registration For 2017-2018

All current families received a registration packet for the upcoming 2017-2018 PSR school year. Registrations for new families are available online, in the back of church, in the PSR office and at the rectory.. Tuition for PSR is as follows:

New PSR families

Kindergarten only \$100 + \$30 registration fee

1 child tuition: \$180 + \$30 registration fee

2 children \$245 + \$30 registration fee

3+ children \$290 + \$30 registration fee

You do not need to pay the total tuition in order to receive the lower rate, simply register and make a partial payment. A registration is considered complete when it has the following included: Registration form completed, Parent Witness Statement signed, tuition payment in full or partial payment including the \$30 registration fee, signed tuition payment form and \$20 Sacramental fee for 2nd and 8th grade. Please include a baptismal certificate for new students. Please tell family, friends and neighbors about our wonderful PSR program and that now is the time to register.
