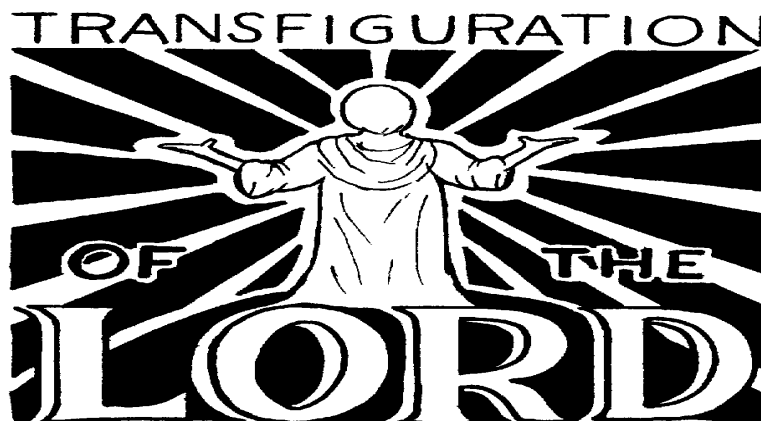

## ...from the Pastor...

...Please welcome our founding pastor, Fr. Bob Leibrecht, this weekend...It's always a blessing to have Fr. Leibrecht back with us for Eucharist. It is particularly fitting this weekend, though, because Fr. Leibrecht also spent a significant part of his priesthood serving in our archdiocesan Latin American Apostolate and this **weekend, August 5-6, is our annual opportunity to provide some material stewardship in support of the missionary work that our archdiocesan priests do there.**

## History

Through an agreement with the Archbishop of La Paz, the first three priests from the Archdiocese of St. Louis were sent in May 1956. The first three priests were Father David Ratermann, Monsignor Andrew Kennedy, and Father Andrew Schierhoff. They began their missionary work in what would become Cristo Rey Parish (Christ the King) in La Paz.



In 1959, Archbishop Ritter invited the Sisters of the Most Precious Blood from O'Fallon, Missouri to serve in a parish school that would be built at Cristo Rey. The first Sisters to be assigned received their mission crosses from Archbishop Ritter in 1959. They were Sister Christine Foeller, Sister Mary John Bosco Sanders, and Sister Mary Fiala, CPPS. The Sisters not only taught in the parish school, but also worked in health care and developed religious education for children, youth, and adults.



Later the Sisters of Loretto also established a mission in Bolivia. In the 1960's a program called Papal Volunteers in Latin America (PAVLA) opened the door for participation of lay missionaries. Frank Clarke and Mary Jane Krekeler were the first to serve and were later joined by twelve other lay people. These fourteen individuals worked in various capacities, including health care services, education and human development programs, cooperatives to provide job training, and care for the poor through the St. Vincent de Paul Society. Other dioceses followed this example set by the Archdiocese of St. Louis.

Currently, three priests from the Archdiocese of St. Louis are serving in our Bolivian Missions. They are:

## Health and Education at Maria Reina

Sickness and dying are one of the realities that accompany all human life, in all parts of the world and in all levels of society. For those living on the hillsides of La Paz, Bolivia, they are a very poignant part of the daily life of our parishioners at Maria Reina Parish. Diagnoses of diabetes have been increasing in these past years, with the people needing insulin or hemodialysis growing at an alarming rate. This causes financial hardship for families and leads to early deaths for many women and men, who often are the only ones supporting their school-aged children. Through the parish clinic, Precious Blood Sister Guillermina Loma of O'Fallon, Missouri, lovingly accompanies these families in their need for encouragement, education and both medical and financial support. As the parish priests, our home and hospital visits prove to be powerful sources of strength and hope for the diabetics and their families. Thanks to the heartfelt generosity of the people of the Archdiocese of St. Louis, Bolivian families know that they are not alone in their hour of need.

The education and formation of our Bolivian children and youth has been an integral part of the mission of the Archdiocese of St. Louis in Bolivia since the beginning over 60 years ago. Accompanying the 19 schools in our different neighborhoods throughout the parish requires the concerted efforts of all three St. Louis priests, thus assuring that the teachers, students and families are accorded the word and warmth of God's loving embrace. In the often precarious family circumstances of their homes, some children do not always find the help they need to do well in school and stay out of trouble. For that reason the School Encouragement program of Maria Reina Parish offers to these children and youth the chance to grow in confidence and hope as they receive homework help and enjoy a couple of good meals each week. Several graduates of the program are now in college and have returned to the area to "stay the course." ...**Blessings to you and your family for more of a safe and restful summer....**

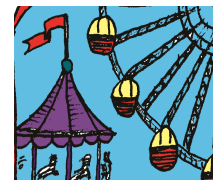
