RITE OF NAMING AND COMMENDATION OF AN INFANT WHO DIED BEFORE BIRTH

At all Masses next weekend we will be celebrating this *Rite of Naming and Commendation of an Infant who Died Before Birth*. This Rite is provided for all parents who have suffered the loss of a child prior to birth in instances when the child's body wasn't fully enough developed to provide the *Rite of Christian Funerals* and burial. When these losses occur this Rite is an opportunity for parents to name their child and commend the child's soul in faith to the loving care of God our Creator. If you have had a miscarriage or otherwise lost a child prior to birth and would like to participate in this Rite, simply **call the Parish Office confidentially and telling us the first and middle name that you would like to give to your child.** Your family name will not be said aloud during the Rite if you prefer that we not do so. The Parish Office will prepare and send to you a commemorative certificate regarding the *Naming and Commendation* of your child.

Candlemas Day, Friday, Feb. 2nd.

February 2nd is exactly 40 days after the birth of Jesus Christ and it is on this day that Mother Mary along with Joseph brought forth their newborn son, Jesus, to the Temple. Mother Mary was cleansed on this day. Jesus was presented to the Lord in the Temple on this day. During this time, an elderly holy man named Simeon was staying in Jerusalem. Simeon was told by the Holy Spirit that his death would not come until he saw the Messiah. When Simeon held the baby Jesus, he knew that Jesus had come for the salvation of all. Simeon stated that Jesus was "A light to the revelation of the Gentiles and the glory of thy people of Israel. The light was the inspiration for the celebration with candles. It was and still remains to this day a Christian celebration of the purification of Mother Mary and the first appearance of Jesus in the Temple. During the early years, people would place their candles outside the church in order to be blessed. They would then carry them in a procession to church in order to imitate the appearance of Jesus in the Temple." Taken from Holiday Calendars

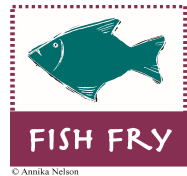
