### ***Solemn Vespers***

Sundays of Advent at 6:00pm

Vespers, or Evening Prayer, is part of the public prayer of the Church called the *Liturgy of the Hours*. Based on the psalms and Jewish synagogue worship, in the *Liturgy of the Hours* the Church sanctifies the significant hours of the day: matins (early morning); lauds (the beginning of the workday); terce, sext, and none (midmorning, midday and midafternoon); vespers (the end of the workday); and compline (nighttime).

It is under the title of the *Immaculate Conception* that Mary is Patroness of the Church in the United States. The Solemnity does bear the obligation to participate in Eucharist. Masses will be at 7:00pm on Friday, December 7<sup>th</sup> and 9:00am on Saturday, December 8<sup>th</sup>.
